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

Dance is the common language of the whole humankind.

Every year on the occasion of the International Dance Day, a message from an outstanding figure of dance or choreography is circulated throughout the world. In the past 40 years, more than 40 message authors have shared with the world their thoughts on art, peace, love, human, including Yuri Grigorovitch, Merce Cunningham, Maurice Bejart, Alicia Alonso, Akram Khan, Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui, etc. In 2022, ITI is honored to have the ballet dancer from the Republic of Korea, the Artistic Director of the Korean National Ballet , Kang Sue-jin as this year's International Dance Day Message Author.

The main celebration of the International Dance Day 2022 has two parts. Honorary doctorate degree in the Department of Dance, Sookmyung Women's University in Seoul, Republic of Korea. Stuttgart Ballet soloist and principal dancer for over 15 years. Appointed as "Kammertanzerin (Royal Court Dancer)", Germany, in 2007. Honorary Ambassador of the PyeongChang 2018 Winter Olympics. KANG Sue-jin uses her fame and her artistic skills for introducing disabled children to dance.

International Dance Day 2022 Message



The Covid-19 catastrophe has stopped life as we so freely knew it and being amidst this tragedy makes us rethink the meaning of "dance" and "dancers" In the distant past, dance was a primal means of expression and communication through gestures; becoming performance art that moved the soul and inspired the audience. It is a momentary art that is difficult to restore to its original form once completed because it's created with the entire body and soul. Dance is made of ephemeral moments, which destines dancers to be on the move forever. Yet, Covid-19 has restricted and even blocked the art of dance in its original form.

Even though the situation is improving, dance performances are still subject to many restrictions. This makes us cherish the precious memories of times when dance and dancers sparkled like jewels, conveying human anguish and anxiety, will and hope for life, and illuminated the world.

Similarly, it is important to recall that during the aftershocks of the Black Death in Medieval Europe, the ballet Giselle depicting love beyond death was performed at the Paris Opera on 28 June 1841 and received an explosive response. Since then, Giselle has been performed all over Europe and around the world to comfort and encourage the souls of mankind ravaged by the pandemic. It is also my understanding of that point, which was first demonstrated in that very performance of Giselle, is the magnificent spirit of a ballerina trying to escape the gravity of the world's hardships.



Today is the 40th Anniversary of International Dance Day (IDD) created by the Dance Committee of ITI in 1982. Report on Proceedings by JUN Hong-jo Vice President of International Dance Committee IDC

In 1982 the Dance Committee (IDC) of ITI created International Dance Day to be celebrated annually on the 29th of April.

For 40 years (except for 1983), ITI-IDC has selected the Message Author every year from all around the world to write a message about the noble spirit of 'dance'.

This year is the 40th Anniversary of IDD and we are very honored to have the first Korean chosen as the Message Author of 2022: KANG Sue-jin, the artistic director of Korean National Ballet. Thereby we're hosting the International Dance Day 2022 Celebration here in Korea and will be announcing the message to the world.

I would like to share the process of the selection of the Message Author briefly; In early December 2021, ITI-IDC sent the request for the recommendation for a candidate.

In late December 2021, the list of nominees selected via 1st online vote was reported to ITI.

In January 2022, in the final vote by ITI Executive Council, the Korean Sue-jin KANG received the largest number of votes and was chosen as the International Dance Day Message Author for 2022.

In the past, famous dancers as Yuri Grigorovich, Maurice Béjart, Alicia Alonso, Jiří Kylián were likely to be selected.

However as the years passed, the selecting process has evolved and took into consideration the social contributions and renovations the artists made to the society.

Jean-Georges Noverre said that the dance is the vehicle in which you can express human emotions and soul. We can be consoled by dance and at the same time console others through dance, and we believe that dance can build up the interaction between mind and body.

I wish all of you a 'Happy Dance Day'!






The On-site Celebration of the International Dance Day 2022 in Seoul, South Korea had invited **30 distinguished guests**, and hundreds of people attended the offline event and watched the live broadcasts on YouTube.

The International Dance Day 2022 had an excellent response on the Internet. News media from all over the world reported on the event. Many performing arts organizations and individuals released relevant information. **10 Message translations** were received, and **12 events** were organized by the global dance community in different ways.
